'Campus Inquiry' back

"Campus Inquiry," a program presented by the Radio-Television Workshop, will return to campus closed-circuit television today.

As before, the program will concentrate on issues which directly affect the students and will continue to interview campus personalities such as SGA officers.

However, Al Abrams, vice-president of news and public affairs for the workshop, said there is also a possibility that the program will host some local guests. He is trying to get Benjamin Wolman, the District Attorney for Prince George's County, to discuss the problem of narcotics on campus.

The program will be shown every other week, rather than every week, as it was last semester.

Abrams, who in the past has been criticized for being one-sided, will concentrate on the SGA elections, giving particular emphasis to the Third Party movement.

The first program of the semester will be presented today. It will be hosted by Eric Schuman, a member of the work shop, and will have a panel consisting of Milo C. Knight, food service director; Harvey Shulman, RHA president and

George McHugh, a student of the university.

Guests will discuss a wide range of topics, including dining hall hours, student employment, student activity facilities for Hill area residents and the new meal ticket plan.

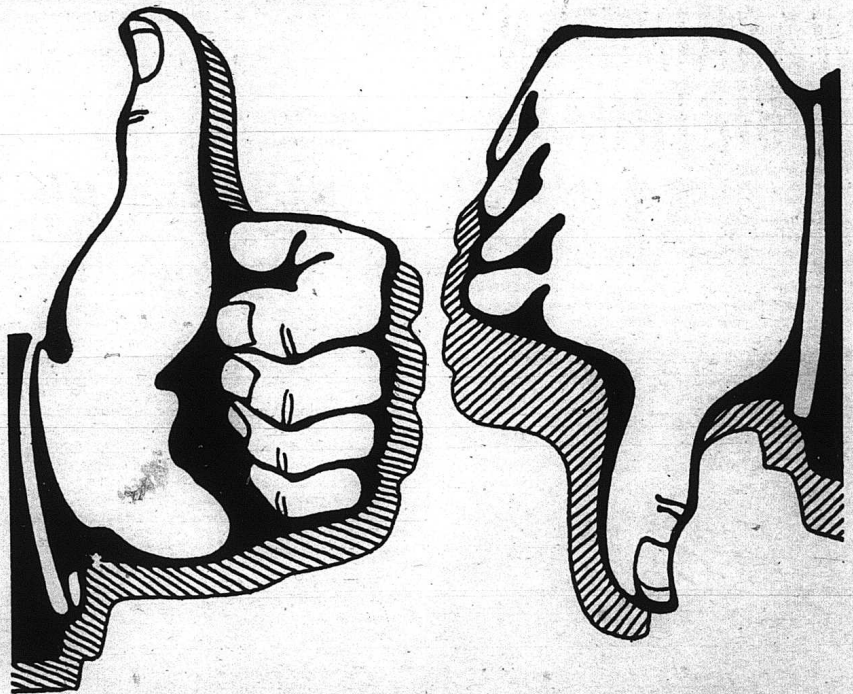


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
