

TV shows teach 6,500 students

More than 6,500 students this semester are enrolled in courses taught by closed circuit television, according to Thomas J. Aylward, University director of radio and television.

Aylward said that the total is a combination of students from speech 1, zoology 1, and math 10 and 11.

The television lectures, which have been used by the University since 1959, are being seen this year by fewer students than in past years, Aylward noted.

"The reason is that the freshman class this year is smaller than in the past," he said. TV lectures usually aid freshman courses.

Offering no explanation, Aylward said that "statistically,

the better and the poorer students learn more from a television lecture" while the average students learn about as much as they would from a live lecture.

Courses are staged by faculty and graduate students enrolled in radio and television.

Teachers teaching television lecture courses may also teach

other courses, he added.

"Television teaching is an effort to provide equal educational opportunities for all students enrolled in a course," he explained.

"This is how the University gives every student a chance to hear a lecture by a highly qualified instructor," he added.

A "justifiable criticism" of television teaching is that it is hard for the student to look up at the screen for an extended period of time, he said.

"We do get student evaluations of the entire speech 1 course,"

"After compiling the infor-

mation," Aylward said, "the student reaction has significantly changed to a more favorable response to television lectures."

There are no future plans to use a building solely for the purpose of closed circuit television teaching. However more dorms: being equipped for reception and eventually color.
